

## **Reformation Lutheran Church**

"Come and See, Learn and Rejoice, Go and Tell!" February, 2020

"O my people, what have I done to you? How have I wearied you? Answer me! For I brought you up from the land of Egypt and redeemed you from the house of slavery, and I sent before you Moses, Aaron, and Miriam." - Micah 6:3.

Perhaps these words sound familiar, as if you've heard them from another place? There is an ancient part of the Good Friday liturgy called the Solemn Reproaches that are modeled after this verse. Psalm 78 also contributes to the form and tenor of the Solemn Reproaches as it lists the many wondrous deeds God has done for his people throughout history.

The Solemn Reproaches are said at the end of Good Friday worship. After the tomb door has been slammed shut in the tenebrae service, the words of God Almighty are spoken in a voice that is broken and disbelieving. The first one goes like this: O my people, O my church, what have I done to you, or in what have I offended you? Answer me. I led you forth from the land of Egypt and delivered you by the waters of baptism, but you have prepared a cross for your Savior.

Years ago, as a new pastor putting together my very first Good Friday worship service bulletin, I sat at my desk and wept as I typed these words into the computer. "How have I offended you?" and "You prepared a cross for your Savior," rang in my ears and broke my heart. Since then it has been the single-most important piece of liturgy I have spoken in worship. Its poignancy moves me to tears each time. The response of the congregation, also being moved to tears, is so powerful. We don't deserve such love as has been showered upon the human race since the creation. We have no answer for God as to why we have done the awful things we have done, and why we have stood by as others have done evil as well. We can only sink to our knees in anguish and pray for forgiveness.

We aren't to Good Friday yet, but when we get there remember the promise: You have been forgiven. Not because you deserve it, but because Jesus loved us enough to go to the cross for our sake. God answered his own question when he sent his Son to save us from sin and death. Amen.
